



A GUIDE FOR POOL ENCLOSURES

WHY DO I NEED A PERMIT?

A Pool Enclosure Permit legally authorizes you to start construction of your pool project in accordance with approved drawings and specifications.

Pool enclosure permits are reviewed for compliance with:

- Grimsby's Pool Fence By-Law.
- Grimsby's Zoning By-law.
- Niagara Escarpment Commission and Conservation Authorities Regulations.
- Other applicable provincial and municipal regulations.

The purpose of a Pool Enclosure Permit is to ensure that zoning requirements, safety standards and other construction standards are met.

WHEN DO I NEED A PERMIT?

A permit must be obtained and fees paid prior to the installation of pools of water for swimming, bathing or wading which is capable of retaining a water depth equal to or greater than 600mm (23 5/8") at any point.

Where a previously permitted swimming pool enclosure is subsequently replaced, the replacement enclosure is subject to the requirements of the Pool Enclosure by-law, including the application for a permit, fee and the requirements and standards specified within.

THREE IMPORTANT REQUIREMENTS WHEN PLANNING YOUR PROJECT



ZONING BY-LAW

When choosing the best location and size for your pool and its appurtenances you will need to comply with Grimsby's Zoning By-Law.

The Zoning By-Law:

- Limits unwanted noises from pool equipment.
- Promotes increased privacy.
- Eliminates potential nuisances.



GRADING AND DRAINAGE

When planning your construction project you will need to identify where your land drainage is conveying surface water.

Your construction project should:

- Prevent water from damaging buildings and adjacent properties.
- Help keep a dryer yard year round.
- Prevent potential civil litigation for property damages.



POOL ENCLOSURE BY-LAW

This By-Law is the minimum design and construction requirements to ensure safe and resilient enclosures.

This By-Law is made to:

- Increases public health and safety.
- Provides restriction for unwanted visitors.
- Promotes more durable and resilient fencing construction.

			PERMIT FEES
			Permit Fees: Calculated and collected at time of permit application submission.
			LEGIBLE AND SCALED SITE PLAN DRAWING INCLUDING (2 COPIES)
			Street name and property address.
			Property lines including lot dimensions (lengths and widths).
			Location of fence and all gates (self-closing and self-latching).
			Provide an elevation view of fence. Include post, cross rail and picket material, size and dimensions.
			Identify dwelling footprint and all other structures-such as sheds, gazebos, garages, and decks.
			Location of any overhead hydro wires on or adjacent to property.
			Include locations and dimensions for all walkways, concrete slabs, curbing or coping for the proposed pool.
			Location of all existing easements/right-of-ways, swales, catch basins, and general drainage characteristics.
			Location and setbacks to pool equipment (heater, pump, filter).
			ZONING AND APPLICABLE LAW AGENCY APPROVALS
