In October 2022, Grimsby residents elected a new Town Council.

Within the first 100 days, the new Council worked together to establish priorities for the term ahead: examining what they heard from Grimsby residents during the campaign, identifying shared priorities, and focusing on major opportunities for the community.

The people of Grimsby made it clear during the election that they expect their Council to work together - individually and collectively - focused on the betterment of the community. In response, Council has set high standards by approving both a philosophy and a set of principles that will guide their relationships with each other, with administration, and with the residents of Grimsby.

Council has made this commitment to its citizens.

Individual Responsibility

Council respects that each member of Council has their own independence and can express their personal views, maintain their own beliefs, and represent the collective interests of their ward. Council also recognizes that each member brings their own perspectives and expectations.

We acknowledge that each member of Council has an individual responsibility not to compromise the integrity of the Council, but rather to collaborate on a common purpose to serve all Grimsby residents, and to uphold the principles of working together to maintain the confidence and trust of the community.

Collective Accountability

No one member of Council fails or succeeds on their own. Council is collectively accountable for the outcomes of its conduct, deliberations, actions, and decisions. Council members are stronger together than they are apart.

Collective accountability requires effort, trust, collaboration, openness, kindness, and transparency, and a commitment to the shared principles of working together.

Leadership Principles

- ▶ ***Achieving and maintaining public trust:*** building the foundation for a legitimate and engaging civic democracy
- ▶ ***Mutual trust and appreciation:*** valuing each other and treating one another fairly and honestly, where everyone's ideas are welcome
- ▶ ***Common purpose and shared results:*** the driving force that establishes success
- ▶ ***Acknowledging differences and resolving conflicts:*** setting a positive attitude and acknowledging individual experiences
- ▶ ***Patience and flexibility:*** fostering tolerance and compromise
- ▶ ***Transparent and open collaboration and communication:*** enabling conversations based on a mutual understanding for clear and open dialogue

Grimsby Town Council is committed to reviewing progress towards these priorities, as well as re-examining the priorities, directions, and actions on a regular basis. This will allow the Town to adjust as needed when important changes occur in the internal or external environment.
