

NOTICE OF PASSING OF A ZONING BY-LAW THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GRIMSBY

TAKE NOTICE that on **December 16, 2019**, the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Grimsby passed By-law No.19-109, pursuant to Section 34 of the Planning Act, RSO., 1990.

THE PURPOSE AND EFFECT of By-law No. 19-109 is to change the zoning of the lands known municipally as **8 Lake Street** from a Residential Detached 2 (RD2) zone to a Site Specific Residential Multiple 1 (RM1) zone with modified performance standards. The modifications would permit the construction of semi-detached units on the subject lands.

Public comments, as summarized in the Planning Staff Report, were considered as part of the decision making process.

A copy of By-law No. 19-109 is attached to this notice.

THE DECISION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GRIMSBY IS FINAL IF A NOTICE OF APPEAL IS NOT RECEIVED ON OR BEFORE THE LAST DAY FOR FILING A NOTICE OF APPEAL.

IF YOU WISH TO APPEAL to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal a copy of an appeal form is available from the LPAT website at http://elto.gov.on.ca/

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a by-law to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.

No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeal unless, before the by-law was passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the council or, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.
